# **Budesonide nasal spray**

## What is this medicine?

BUDESONIDE is a nasal spray containing budesonide, a corticosteroid. It prevents the release of substances in the body that cause inflammation. Budesonide is used to treat nasal symptoms such as congestion, sneezing, and runny nose caused by seasonal or year-round allergies. Budesonide is also used to keep nasal polyps from coming back after surgery to remove them. Budesonide may also be used for purposes other than those listed in this medication guide.

# What should I tell my health care provider before I take this medicine?

You should not use this Budesonide if you are allergic to budesonide.

Before using Budesonide, tell your doctor if you have been sick or had an infection of any kind. You may not be able to use Budesonide until you are well.

Also tell your doctor if you are allergic to any drugs, or if you have:

- · liver disease;
- glaucoma or cataracts;
- · herpes simplex virus of your eyes;
- · tuberculosis or any other infection or illness;
- · sores or ulcers inside your nose; or
- · if you have recently had injury of or surgery on your nose.

FDA pregnancy category B. Budesonide is not expected to be harmful to an unborn baby. Tell your doctor if you are pregnant or plan to become pregnant during treatment. It is not known whether budesonide passes
