Songbird by Oasis GenreRockChordsG, G/F#, and EmTabsSongbird TabsMost people know Oasis from their mega-popular song Wonderwall. On their fifth studio album Heathen Chemistry, released in 2003, critics heralded a different song, Songbird. Liam Gallagher was praised for his superb songwriting; one writer even called it the most compelling song on the album. Written as a tribute to his then-fiancee Nicole Appleton, it was one of the songwriters simplest and brightest songs he had ever written.Learn this lesser-known easy Oasis song before you learn Wonderwall. The songs chords, with a cool bass movement, are easy to play. After you play your basic open G chord, shift the lowest note down a fret. Then switch to Em. Then you got it! 69. Mollys Lips by Nirvana GenreRockChordsG and CTabsMollys Lips TabsMollys Lips by Nirvana is a cover song from the band the Vaselines. Released in 1991 on Sub Pop records, the song was featured on a split single with the band the Fluid. Frontman Kurt Cobain contested its release stating that their version was weak. Nonetheless, it was released in a contract buyout deal that would launch the bands career.Kurt Cobain has never claimed to be a guitar hero. This is why many Nirvana songs are easy to play on guitar. Their version of Mollys Lips demands open chords G and C. Make sure you can switch between the two comfortably. You will see these chords elsewhere on our list, so makes sure you know them well. 70. What I Got by Sublime GenreRockChordsD and GTabsWhat I Got TabsWho knows how far Sublimes star could have risen. In the late 90s, their singer and principal songwriter Bradley Nowell died from a heroin overdose. Their song What I Got, released posthumously, became a huge success in radio rotation, reaching number one on the Billboard Modern Rock Tracks chart. Rolling Stone magazine listed the song at 83 on their list of 100 Greatest Guitar Songs of All Time.Although the band struggled with drug addiction, the feel-good vibes of What I Got made everything seem okay. All you need is two chords. Be able to switch effortlessly between them while keeping the strumming pattern. This song may be challenging because the D chord uses three fingers. But put in the work, and you will be rewarded. 71. Closer by Ne-Yo GenrePopChordsEm, C5, C, and AmTabsCloser TabsWith the release of Closer in 2008, the American recording artist Ne-Yo pivoted to dance-pop. The song was more rhythmic and urban sounding than any other song he produced. As the lead single from his third studio album, Year of the Gentleman, the song depicts a growing attraction between a man and a woman. The song accounts for a burning desire to come closer to her. The song reached number seven on the Billboard Hot 100 and was featured in TV shows Gossip Girl and 90210.Learn this song with four simple chords. Three of them will be from your basic open chords. The C5, better known as a power chord, only requires two notes. Switching from open chords to power chords might be strange, so practice it carefully. Once you get it, youll become closer to becoming a guitar hero. 72. Tulsa Time by Eric Clapton GenreRockChordsA and E7TabsTulsa Time TabsIn 1978, songwriter Danny Flowers and country artist Don Williams were staying at a hotel in Oklahoma when they were suddenly snowed in. With nothing better to do than to wait out the storm, they spent a half-hour writing this two-chord song. While Eric Clapton was opening for Don Williams, he came across the song and was instantly transfixed. He wanted to record it right away, but not after Don Williams recorded his version first.Had mother nature not reared its ugly head, we would have never heard Tulsa Time. Like so many others on our list, this easy song only asks for two chords. Its another song for absolute beginners. Spend some time with Tulsa Time, and youll get it. 73. Lady in Black by Uriah Heep GenreRockChordsAm and GTabsLady in Black TabsThe Lady in Black was the fourth track off of 1971s album Salisbury. The single, written by the English rock band Uriah Heep, was written as a rock ballad and tells a story about a mysterious visit. Ken Hensley says the inspiration came from a surprise visit from a vicars daughter when he was depressed. Although the song was never released as a single in the UK or US, it achieved great success in Germany and Russia.Sometimes all a songwriter needs is two chords. Lady in Black doesnt follow a typical verse-chorus structure. Instead, it relies on a repetitive vamp. Uriah Heeps song Lady in Black may not be well-known in America, but its a great song for beginner guitarists to learn. 74. Something in the Way by Nirvana GenreRockChordsEm and C/GTabsSomething in the Way TabsIf youve watched Showtimes recent TV series Yellowjackets, you heard this song. The song was featured in an episode. Its haunting sound played into the emotions of the storyline. Something in the Way, from Nirvanas 1991 album Nevermind, was never released as a single. That didnt stop it from appearing on the Billboard charts in 2022.Learn another great Nirvana song with only two chords. The Em chord should be memorized by now. The C/G, maybe not so much. Make things easier by thinking about the chord as a standard C chord, but put a finger on the third fret of the sixth string. You might need to rearrange your fingers, but it will become an easy chord to grab. 75. When Love Comes to Town by U2 GenreRockChordsE and ATabsWhen Love Comes to Town TabsFew people can forget that U2 tried to pull a fast one by including their album on an Apple iTunes update. No one asked for it. But before they thought this was a good idea, the Irish rock band recorded When Love Comes to Town with blues legend B.B. King. Released in 1989 on Rattle and Hum, the song reached number the top ten on the Irish Singles Chart, UK Singles Chart, Dutch Top 40, and US Mainstream Rock Tracks Chart.Learn this simple, simple, simple U2 song with two chords. As the last song on our list, you should be able to play both E and A in your sleep. Listen to the recording to match the strumming pattern. In fact, this is a great idea for fostering your development as a guitarist getting confident playing basic songs will improve your sense of rhythm and help you develop confidence.[1] I Learn a G major. Place your ring finger on the top string (the sixth string), on the third fret. Your middle finger goes a string below on the second fret. Then use your pinky to play the third fret on the lowest, thinnest string (the first string). You can also play this chord with your index, middle, and ring fingers, though it is harder to transition to other chords like this. Strum all strings.--3---0----0----2---3- 2Learn a C major: Your fingers form a diagonal line up towards your face. Your ring finger is on the fifth string (the A string), third fret. Your middle is on the third string, second fret, and the index goes down on the second string, first fret.--0---1----0---2---3---0- Advertisement 3Learn a D major. Place your index finger on the third string, second fret. Place your middle finger on the first string, second fret, then finally lay your ring finger on the second string, third fret. You'll have a little triangle with your fingers on the bottom three strings. You only strum the bottom four strings.--2---3---2---0---x---x- -4Learn an E major and minor. Place your second finger (middle) on the second fret of the A string. Place your ring finger down on the second fret of the D string. Finally, place your index finger on the first fret of the G string, the third string from the bottom.--0----0----0----2---2----0-Make an E-major chord by simply adding your index finger on the third string, first fret.[2] Advertisement 1Purchase a capo to make it easier to sing or adjust pitch. A capo clamps down on all six strings, allowing you to play these chords anywhere on the neck. Basically, wherever the capo goes becomes the new "0" in your chords. This allows you to keep the same shape and play songs in any key.The following songs have a capo in them, but you can still play them without one. Note, however, that the songs will sound off-key from recorded versions.2Play Boston's "Piece of Mind" with a capo on the ninth fret. This great little riff sounds good electric or acoustic. It has a fast rhythm to it -- one strum on the first and third chords, two on the second and forth. If you can throw in some muted notes, even better.Capo: 9thChord Shape Progression: Em - C - G - D3Play Beyonce's "If I Were a Boy." A slower tempo song, this sounds great on acoustic. Simply strum down four times on each chord. It is just a slower version of the Boston song.Capo: 11thChord Shape Progression: Em - C - G - D4Play Green Day's "When I Come Around." Simple and easy, play four strums on the first two chords. Then strum the third chord twice, once coming up with the pick. Then play the final chord four times.Capo: 11thChord Shape Progression: G - D - Em - C5Play Bon Jovi's "It's My Life." Play eight driving, quick strums on each chord, or four sets of up/down strumming. Keep this consistent beat (these are eighth notes) going.Capo: 8thChord Shape Progression: Em - C - G - D - Em - C - D6Play Bob Marley's "No Woman No Cry." This requires a simple reggae "up-stroke" pattern. Only play the chord by picking upwards, towards your face. As your hand comes back down, lift your fingers slightly off the chord so you get a muted "chick" as you strum down the guitar, towards your feet.Capo: 5thChord Shape Progression: G - D - Em - C - G - C - G - C - G - D7Play The Beatles "Let it Be." Just like Bon Jovi's song, you just need gentle, calm strums. For each measure ("1 and, 2 and, 3 and, 4 and, 1 and..."), you want to strum on the "1," pause, the strum twice for the "2 and." Play the "3," pause, then strum twice for the "4 and."Capo: 5thChord Shape Progression: Em - D - C - G - D - C - G8Play Eagle Eye Cherry's "Save the Night.: Simple and easy, strum it like normal for the entire bar, but hit the last chord, right before you switch, harder and louder.Capo: 5thChord Shape Progression: Em - C - G - D9Play Aerosmith's "Cryin'." The strumming is simple and basic -- three up/down strums for each chord.Capo: 2ndChord Shape Progression: G - D - Em - C - G - D - C.10Play John Denver's "Country Roads." Another simple, folksy strum pattern. At the beginning of every measure, just strum the top string of the chord to get a nice, bouncy feel to the song.Capo: 2ndChord Shape Progression: G - D - Em - C - G - D - C - G11Play Joan Osborne's "One of Us." This final song has a few nifty tricks in it to push your guitar skills, but you can skip them if you're still practicing. To get the intro riff, you use all the same notes in your normal chords. When transitioning chords, simply keep the last three strings in place for 1 measure. A capo makes certain chords easier to play, because you can suddenly play barre chords as open chords, because the capo holds the notes you would have to bar down for you. It also changes the texture and timbre of particular chords. A G chord played as a D form above the seventh fret sounds bright, whereas a standard G form sounds full and mellow. Question How much is a capo? Capos can be anywhere from \$5-\$50. You can buy capos online or in music stores. Question How do I keep my fingers from getting sore? After you play guitar for a while your fingers will get used to it. Your fingers might only hurt for a little bit as a beginner; play less at the beginning, then slowly build up.
