Remember: Using a lye calculator can help you (safely) align your ingredient proportions with your desired result. Lemongrass Essential Oil 1/2 tsp. All you need to provide is distilled water, a mixing bowl, stick blender and thermometer. Another bonus? Water is an essential ingredient. As it melts, prepare the lye solution.
