The menu includes entrees, shareables, and specialty sips. We ordered a lot to try and started with the Atomic Fusion Pretzel for \$10.49, which was buffalo-style and loaded with chicken. We also tried the Quantum Pretzel, a Bavarian-style pretzel with sharp cheddar cheese-beer sauce. The hot sauce added a great kick to the Atomic Fusion Pretzel. Pym Test Kitchen menu includes a \$100 Family-sized Pym-ini Sandwich, salami, rosemary ham, provolone, and sun-dried tomato spread on toasted focaccia bread. We also tried the Pingo Doce soda, which is a reference to Bruce Banner's time in Rio de Janeiro. You can get this drink from the Coke Machines! The menu offers many options for drinks and food, including specialty sips and mobile order locations. The \$100 Sandwich was a gigantic arugula salad served with a massive piece of fried chicken on a tiny bun, accompanied by potato bites and a brioche bun. It was huge enough to fill up 6-8 people and was priced at \$15.49. The Not So Little Chicken Sandwich was also comical, featuring a massive chicken breast on a small bun served with teriyaki and red chili sauces, pickled cabbage slaw, and brioche. This had a little zest but our biggest critique was the bun, which we felt lacked enough bread for all that chicken. The Caesar Salad and Colossal Crouton was a big slice of romaine with sparse dressing, but the garlic crouton was seasoned well and cost \$12.49. The PB3 Superb Sandwich was a standout eat featuring peanut butter, candied bacon, banana, micro-banana smoothie, and crispy potato bites. It was tasty but had a lot of flavors meshing together, especially with the bacon. The Impossible Spoonful was rigatoni pasta with plant-based meatballs, tomato sauce, and dairy-free parmesan, served with a mandarin, coconut milk yogurt, and low-fat milk or water. This dish was solid and flavorful but had a different texture to the meatball. You can also grab additional items like Arugula Salad, Slaw, or sauces to go with your meal. We opted for the Candied Bacon instead for \$3.79 and it was super candied, sweet, and gooey. For dessert, we got the massive Celestial-sized Candy Bar. Choco-Smash CANDY Bar made with dark chocolate, peanuts, caramel, nougat, and chocolate brownie for \$7.99. You can also purchase a Glowing Pym Particle Disc or Capsule for \$5.49, but honestly, we thought these were overpriced. If you want to feed a group of people, this is a great spot with a variety of options including shareable eats like the giant sandwich. It's also perfect for Marvel fans and those looking for unique theme park food. Just keep in mind that it can be pricey and the options are pretty basic. Overall, if you're looking for the full superhero experience at Avengers Campus, this is a must-visit spot with tasty and creative eats!
