For improved organization, bind the worksheets or store them in a large freezer bag. Did you know that kids are more likely to learn the name of a letter if they learn the sound first? Well, now you know that phonetical awareness is the key to helping kids understand the alphabet! This cover page adds a personal touch to the activity. It can also be an opportunity for kids to practice writing out their names. Use a dot marker to discriminate between the uppercase H and lowercase h according to the color guide. Practice the letter sound, then read the sentence and color in the hamburger. Practice saying and identifying the letter h sound. Say ‘h is for hamster’ and then have the kids name other objects or nouns that start with h. Dot the bubble letters with a dot marker or stickers. It can also be colored in along with the images. Remember to add these words to the letter h vocabulary list. This is a vocabulary page that will help the kids learn new words or practice the letter h sound. This can also be used as a spelling test. Simply cover the words! This fun activity is colorful and makes letter formation more enjoyable. Kids will learn to spot differences and improve problem-solving and decision-making skills. Then, they can place the letters in the correct sections. Trace and cut out the letters. Then, identify the images and paste the letters into the blocks. Read the word out loud. Place the uppercase and lowercase letters in the correct boxes. Name each picture and then place them into the correct block. The ‘thumbs down’ pictures are still a good addition to the kids’ vocabulary and can be used to show differences. Tracing is an excellent pre-writing activity. It is the first step to being able to write out the letters correctly.
