The Enchanting Tower is perfect for survival, especially for beginners, and can be built on a Minecraft Earth 8x8 build plate. A video guide explains the process, starting with stone bricks on the bottom corners and cobblestone walls, then adding stone brick stairs and finishing with wood, trapdoors, and stone stairs. Using spruce and oak, this survival tower is massive and includes many rooms for smelting, storage, crafting, enchanting, bedrooms, farm facilities, and a nether portal. Start by placing a torch to mark the center, making sure you can build at least nine blocks up and outwards. ItsMarloe explains the rest of the process in this video. For the mage tower, use granite and other block types for a fantasy-like appearance. The base will be built using three, five, and seven blocks, stacking stone bricks to create the roof structure. Oak slabs and stripped spruce are used to complete the top story, making it look incredibly good straight out of a movie. This structure is based on the initial layout along the diagonal wall, with main walls stretching 16 granite blocks high, utilizing temporary blocks for corners and deepslate blocks for outside structure, adding entrances by removing five blocks. To add a magical touch, amethyst blocks surrounded by stone can be used, or a hole in the middle with Blackstone and an end crystal for a beam effect. This tower combines Minecraft building influences, including East charm and steampunk mystery, requiring 2439 blocks, mostly stone, to build a 41-level tower with plenty of storage and view-admiring spaces. Another option is a Victorian-influenced tower with blocky sharp edges, comprising mostly spruce wood, relatively cheap, and unfurnished, offering storage and crafting spaces. A steampunk tower made of 1154 Dark Prismarine blocks offers storage space and a perfect spot for an enchanter, despite being elaborate and potentially difficult to follow. For a wizard-like experience, a tower with a glass base and curved staircase leading to the Nether Portal is available, mostly made of stone bricks and nethrite brick, looking grand but potentially lacking in storage space. The Crooked Wizard Tower, primarily made of spruce wood, is small, easy to make, and functional, with added details like vines and wooden planks for charm. Lastly, a gothic-influenced manor-like structure offers two towers, providing a unique building experience. This unique design deviates from previous projects by offering ample space and a breathtaking view through an elevated gallery connecting the two structures. Typically, twin towers are constructed using wood or cobblestone, but this one takes it to new heights - literally, as it spans 50 levels. This isn't a beginner's project; you'll need experience to tackle something of this scale. However, not everyone wants to live in futuristic marvels or floating spires; some players prefer diving straight into the world as a wizard, and that's perfectly fine. To cater to these individuals, we've included the Simple Medieval Tower on our list. Constructed primarily from wood, it reaches 18 levels and incorporates leaves for decoration, making it an accessible option for those who struggle with complex designs. For players seeking a secure base of operations, the Watchtower is an excellent choice. This imposing structure is built from stone and goes up to 50 levels, complete with its own portcullis and customizable flag. From the top, you can launch attacks on hostile mobs using fireworks-loaded crossbows, giving you a sense of security and control. With 1077 blocks in total, this tower reaches level 26 and features a mix of stone blocks and bricks. While unfurnished, it has ample space inside and can be decorated freely. The tower appears massive but is made of 1649 blocks, mainly brick, oak wood, stairs, and cobblestone. These intricate designs offer a mix of fantasy turrets, gothic spires, and more, allowing players to express their creativity in Minecraft's survival mode.
