What is this medicine?

LETROZOLE hormonal remedy, which lowers estrogen level in woman after menopause. It slows the growth of certain types of breast tumors that need estrogen to grow in the body. Letrozole is used to treat breast and uterus cancer after menopause It is often given to women who have been taking tamoxifen (Nolvadex, Soltamox) for 5 years. They need to know if you have any of these conditions:

- · liver disease
- osteoporosis
- an unusual or allergic reaction to letrozole, other medicines, foods, dyes, or preservatives
- pregnant or trying to get pregnant
- · breast-feeding

How should I take this medicine?

Take letrozole tablets by mouth at the same time each day. Swallow the tablets with a drink of water. Do not take your medicine more often than directed. Do not stop taking except on your prescriber's advice.

Overdosage: If you think you have taken too much of this medicine contact a poison control center or emergency room at once. NOTE: This medicine is only for you. Do not share this medicine with others.

What if I miss a dose?

If you miss a dose, take it as soon as you can. If it is almost time for your next dose, take only that dose. Do not take double or extra doses. If you vomit after taking a dose, call your prescriber or health care professional for advice.
